1. Introduction

At the Blidworth and Rainworth Primary School Partnership, we believe wearing a school uniform encapsulates our school values and establishes a clear sense of pride, identity and community within our children. Therefore, it is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside of normal school hours. This policy has been agreed by our Governors in accordance with the *Department for Education* guidelines, so that costs to families are kept to a minimum.

2. Jewellery

On health and safety grounds, we do not feel it is appropriate for children to wear jewellery to school, and any parents who allow their child to do so must accept responsibility for any injuries that may occur as a result of their child wearing it. However, we would accept children wearing a watch, (**no smart connected watches**), or plain stud earrings. A child who wears jewellery to school will be required to remove it themselves before participating in PE lessons, or parents/carers must have removed it in preparation.

3. Make-Up and false nails

Children must not wear make-up or false nails to school

4. Role of Parents/Carers

We expect the support of parents and carers in providing the correct school uniform for their child each day, that is clean and in good repair.

The schools welcome children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are significant reasons, for example religious grounds, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform, then the school will look considerately at such requests.

We will always look to support parents and work with them in ensuring their children have and wear the correct uniform.

5. Role of Governors

The Governing Body supports the Senior Leadership of the schools in implementing the School Uniform Policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the policy and liaises with the Senior Leadership Teams to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity.

It is the Governors' responsibility to monitor that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the School Uniform Policy helps children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical and reasonably priced.

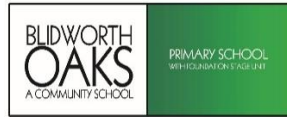
6. Non-Compliance

In the event of a child/parent being unable to comply, or refusing to comply, with this policy the school will, in the first instance, seek to understand the reasons for non-compliance and work with the family to put a plan in place, and set a deadline for ensuring uniform meets school expectations.

We may do this by:

- contacting parents/carers to discuss uniform expectations;
- discussing uniform expectations with children;
- providing alternative items of clothing or footwear, such as plimsolls;
- implementing sanctions in line with the school's behaviour policy;
- using school funding, such as Pupil Premium funding, to support the purchasing of uniform;
- making agreements between school and home about any modifications needed to school uniform for grounds such as Religion, special educational needs or medical conditions.

White or Blue Polo Shirt, Shirt or Blouse
Plain Black Footwear Any logos/ edging on footwear must also be black. We require all children to wear shoes that are practical and enable them to access our learning and play environments safely.
